# BOB BETTS TO RETIRE SEPTEMBER 30

General Manager Bob Betts will conclude a distinguished 52-year career in radio when he retires as WMSE general manager on September 30. He will be available to assist us as a consultant.

Bob was named WMSE general manager in 1984 after previously serving as MSOE's alumni director since 1979. He brought stability to the station during a difficult period in its history.

In high school, Bob began a career in broadcasting that included news director for KOIA radio in Des Moines from 1959-60 and again from 1963-64; building and managing KNIA radio in Knoxville, Iowa from 1960-63; news director of WOKY radio in Milwaukee from 1964-70 and news director of WEMP-WNUW in Milwaukee from 1970-76. He holds a journalism degree from Drake University.

There will be a retirement reception for Bob on September 30 from 4:30-7:00 p.m. at the Up and Under Pub, 1216 E. Brady.

Bob's retirement has resulted in some restructuring of station management. His duties as part-time general manager will be divided between Rod Gnerlich and Tom Crawford and that position will be eliminated.

Tom has been promoted to station operations manager, effective October 1. He will continue as WMSE's chief fund raiser but will also take on a variety of new responsibilities including:

- Coordination, evaluation, and day-today supervision of all station and community volunteers.
- Ensuring that WMSE promotes the university through MSOE-oriented public service announcements and MSOE-oriented programs.
- Final evaluation and clearance of staff who finish training.
- Recruiting new broadcast, engineering and support staff as needed.
- Customer service to station clients including individuals requesting public service announcements, record company representatives, etc.

Paul Host will continue to supervise the station's Music Department, assign specific shows to djs and evaluate programming, format, and show quality.

Music Director Mike Johnston, Training Director Pete Rohde, and Engineering Director Scott Merbeth will continue in their present roles.

In addition, the station will be hiring two additional students, effective October 1. One will serve as a clerical assistant in the Music Department. Duties for the other are still being determined.

#### Office Hours

In order to have a member of management available over a larger portion of the day, Tom Crawford's office hours will be 11 a.m.-7:30 p.m. Wednesday through Friday and 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m. Monday and Tuesday.

### SIGNAL BOOST FUNDING NEARS HALFWAY MARK

WMSE has raised \$15,000 through August toward the purchase of new transmission equipment required to boost its signal as of



September 15. The fund raising effort is expected to top the \$20,000 mark by the end of the fiscal year's first quarter September 30.

This opens up the possibility of moving our target date for boosting the signal to January 1,

1995. The current planned target is March 17, 1995, the station's 14th anniversary.

WMSE raised more than \$50,000 in cash and gifts-in-kind during fiscal 1993-94. This breaks out as follows:

Program underwriting	\$40,975.00
Benefit concerts	\$ 4,372.00
"Friends of WMSE" Fund	\$ 2,130.00
T-Shirt & Merchandise Sales .	. \$ 347.00
Equipment Gifts	\$10,032.00

In addition, trades, where the station provides announcements in exchange for permission to set up remote broadcasts at festivals such as River Walk and Maritime Days, were valued at \$26,090.

\$37,750.00 was returned to the university to offset the station's annual overhead (\$68,000 during the last fiscal year). The remaining revenue was escrowed toward the power boost project.

Our long-range goal is to have the station completely self-funded. Beginning in fiscal 1995-96 our goal will be to reimburse 65% of the budget and that percentage will increase incrementally until the station totally supports itself through various fund raising enterprises.

#### **GUEST POLICY**

The station's Management Committee, working with the college's Public Safety Department, has adopted the following guidelines, effective immediately:

Guests are classified as individuals or groups of individuals who are not listed as regular members of the WMSE staff on the station roster: non-interview guests (example: dj assistants) and interview guests (bands, community service leaders, etc.).

Staff members are allowed no more than TWO non-interview guests in the station between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight. The only exceptions are station underwriting clients or other business visitors who are there to meet with Tom Crawford. Only one dj assistant is be permitted in the station after midnight. No other guests are permitted between midnight and 6 a.m.

More than two interview guests are permitted in the station. Because of the limited space, it is recommended that you have no more than 3-4 guests in the studio at one time for interviews.

#### Procedure for Admitting Non-Interview Guests

 Notify the public safety officer at the Loock Hall entrance in advance that you will be having guests and who they are.

Important: All guests should have identification with them. Like other residence hall guests, they may be checked by the public safety officer at the Loock Hall entrance and will not be permitted to enter if they are without I.D. You will be held responsible for the conduct of your guests.

#### Procedure for Admitting Interview Guests

 All interview guests must be cleared in advance before they will be permitted into the station. Contact either:

- 2. Once the guests have been approved, leave their names at the public safety desk along with the name of the manager who cleared them. You are to pick them up at the public safety desk and escort them back to the desk immediately upon the conclusion of the interview.
- 3. On occasion, potential interviewees may "drop in" at the station without notifying you first. In this situation, the public safety desk will inform you of their arrival. If you choose to bring them into the station for an interview, you must first contact any of the listed managers and give that manager's name to the public safety desk officer once clearance has been authorized.

Important: All guests should have identification with them. They may be checked by the public safety officer at the Loock Hall entrance and they will not be permitted to enter if they are without I.D.. You will be held responsible for the conduct of your guests.

Falsifying information to gain access for guests will result in dismissal from WMSE.

When doing the weather note the temperature as \_\_\_ degrees at the MSOE campus.



## COMING SOON... WMSE ON-LINE

Thanks to alumni and MSOE engineer/WMSE dj Mark Kappel and Pat Volkman, the station will soon begin operating its own computer bulletin board.

WMSE On-Line will enable listeners with a phone modem to talk to anyone at



the station via a special WMSE-operated computer bulletin board. Each dj will have his or her own password into the system to obtain messages and will also

be able to answer those messages. The bulletin board will only be able to handle outgoing local calls.

The system is currently being tested and awaiting connection of an outside telephone line.

We hope to use WMSE On-Line to also provide information such as our program schedule; remote broadcast dates and sites; and concert information. It opens up a wide range of possibilities and we're very anxious to get it up and running.
